Then & Now



The Maplewood Hotel in Pittsfield, shown above in 1908, was one of many uses of **the Maplewood** Avenue site since the early 1800s, including army barracks in the War of 1812, a prep school for Williams College and the Pittsfield Young Ladies Institute. Arthur W. Plumb bought it in 1889 and operated it as a hotel until his death in 1931. In 1937, much of it was razed, but one wing was saved and converted into **the Maplewood** Apartments, which survive today, below. A development partnership announced plans in March to create 20 luxury condominiums in the building ranging in price from \$200,00 to \$400,000.
